Then the focus will be on exploring the back end of Wordpress Sites – how to use the text editor, how to manage images, and how to include

If you are contemplating creating a new web site (or transitioning your current site to a new system), this session will give you a good idea of the power and potential for WordPress. As WordPress becomes increasingly popular, being able to use this CMS is a desirable professional qualification. This session will get you started. 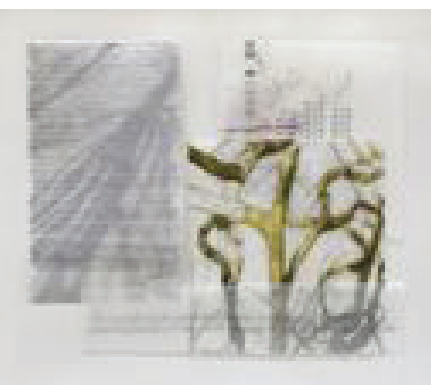
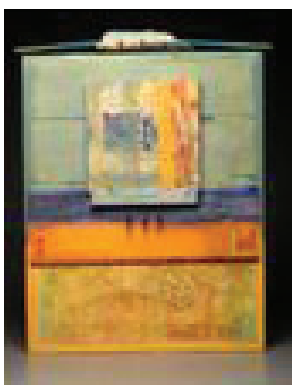

**\$5000 Grant Illustrates Community Partnership**
